Welcome To Summer!!

We have lots of fun and exciting things planned for this summer. We'll make the most of the beautiful summer weather with lots of outside play time, while inside we will be doing lots of crafts. We want the summer to be fun, safe, and enjoyable for all. Please be sure that you child is here by 9:00 AM each day with everything that he/she needs to fully participate in all activities.



For Parents: A Few Rules to Live By

1. Children should come to school on water play days wearing their bathing suits under their clothes. (see themes for dates)
2. **Sunscreen needs to be applied at home every morning.** We will reapply in the afternoon. You can either supply us with sunscreen or choose to use sunscreen which will be supplied by the Center.
3. Children need foam rubber sandals with an ankle strap for water play – **NO FLIP FLOPS or WATER SHOES.** Flip flops are not safe on the playground and water shoes stay wet for a long time, are difficult to put on, and acquire a foul odor very quickly. Sneakers are needed for the playground.
4. Each child needs a beach towel with his/her name clearly written on it.
5. Each child needs to have a complete change of clothes including underwear and socks in his/her cubby (just in case)! In addition, children need a daily change of clothes for when we are done with the water.

6. Please fill out the sign/in- sign/out sheet completely EVERYDAY. Be sure to write in the first and last names, times, and a daytime phone number.
7. Each child needs a **small** blanket for naptime; it gets chilly with the air conditioner. **NO SLEEPING BAGS OR LARGE PILLOWS.**
8. Please, **DO NOT** send children to school wearing **flip flops** -. When children come to school wearing shoes without an ankle strap, their activities will be restricted – no climbing. They are not safe on the playground.
9. Please empty your child's cubby and pocket daily and pay attention to the bulletin board/white boards for things that your child needs for projects and special events that are posted there.
10. **NO TOYS FROM HOME!** We have plenty of toys to keep everyone busy and we do not want children's special things to get lost or broken.

- Use gentle hands and feet.
- Clean up toys when you are done.
- Use kind words.

Expectations of Behavior

We want to create an environment that encourages independence and responsible behavior in

which children are respectful of both teachers and each other. Children are expected to try to be responsible for their own belongings- clothes, bathing suits, towels – when changing; they will also be setting up their own lunches, trying to open their own containers before going to the teacher and cleaning up. We will be working on these skills all summer and the coming year with hopes that children will be able to do these things independently and confidently as they head off to bigger schools.

Children are expected to follow classroom rules. If a rule is broken, children will be asked to identify the problematic behavior and to tell how the problem can be rectified. After a reminder about the rule in question, the child will return to his/her activity. If the problem persists, the child will be directed to another activity. If necessary, the child will be separated from the group for a couple of minutes to calm down and regain his/her composure.
